CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

During this summer there were many calls for spiritual support needed by Council members and/or their families.

Alex Weimer, a 60-year member of the Knights of Columbus, died on July 12, 2006. His wife, Myrtle, preceded him in death. Survivors include 7 children, 22 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. His Funeral Mass was on July 15th at Christ King Church.

Other sad news to report concerns the deaths of wives of two Council members. **Nick Shadid's wife, Laverne**, died on June 29th and was buried from St. Margaret Mary Church. Most recent was the death on August 21st of **Herb Wehner's wife, Mary**, who had been very active with the ladies of our Council. Her Funeral Mass was at St. Mary's Visitation Parish in Elm Grove.

Two of our Council brothers have recently requested our prayers for family members who have serious health problems. **Bob Kalscheur** wants prayers for his "kid brother", **Reg. Don Winger** asks prayers for a sister-in-law who is seriously ill and for a grandson with long-term health problems. We understand that **Reg Kalscheur** is finally on a firm road to recovery after being stricken with leukemia and a serious infection that put him at death's door in early August.

Brother knights recently added to our sick list include **Jim Healy**, who just joined KC early this year and is now recovering from knee surgery, and **Bill Bakula**, who transferred to our Council several years ago and is now undergoing chemotherapy. **Mike Jakus**, our Bingo Program chairman, broke his pelvis in an unfortunate fall while "up north" around the Fourth of July weekend.

Also, don't forget **Del & Lorraine Petersen**; **Del** still in long-term care at a Pewaukee nursing home and **Lorraine** recovering from gall bladder surgery after months of "doctoring" to find the cause of continuing health problems.

GREETINGS FROM YOUR NEW CHAPLAIN!

I have been asked to fill some really big shoes in succeeding Father Birringer, a dear friend. It isn't that I have not been approached in the past to join the Knights of Columbus, but now that I am retired, I feel that I will have the time to serve as chaplain. I have already met a number of the Knights and their spouses at several liturgies and functions of Council #3702. I realize, however, that this newsletter reaches everyone and so I thought it would be appropriate in this first message from the chaplain to say something about myself.

I have been a priest of the Milwaukee Archdiocese for 42 years having been ordained in 1964 by Archbishop Cousins. I celebrated my first mass at St. Mary Parish in Hales Comers where my folks lived and had a shoe store. I used to help my dad repair and sell shoes. Not too many of us have spent our priesthood in one county, but I am one of those who was never assigned outside Milwaukee County.

My first two assignments were as an assistant at St. Alexander and later at St. Casimir Parishes. Then I was asked to serve as a Newman Chaplain for the downtown schools MSOE, MATC, Bryant Stratton and others. After two and a half years, the rector of St. Francis Seminary called to see if I would be willing to be Spiritual Director at the sem. I told him that I was interested. I was there for nine & one-half years during which time I served as Director of Formation, Admissions Director, and teacher. I also took courses at Marquette in Theology and also assisted in parishes on weekends.

When I left St. Francis I went to St. John Cathedral as an associate for two years which turned out to be a very interesting and beneficial experience. Since I had never worked with parish councils or committees, what I learned there I was able to apply later to my ministry as pastor of a parish. It also was a chance to minister to the poor and street people whom we fed at noon five days a week and sheltered on occasion. And I had the opportunity of living with Archbishop Weakland and met many of his guests as they came to visit him.

One evening I received a call from the Priest Personnel Director asking me if I would be willing to become pastor of St. Rita Parish in West Allis. I asked him how much time I would have to ponder the request and he said I could call him the next morning! In having talked over the possible assignment with the Archbishop over breakfast the next morning, he agreed that it was something I should do.

I was pastor at St. Rita for ten years. At that time there were over 2000 households and I had two associates. Finally I became pastor of St. Joseph in Wauwatosa where there were 1400 households and an associate for the first five years. After having been there for 13 years, I retired in July of this year. My stay at St. Joseph's was enjoyable, but I must confess that among the many duties a pastor has, the most difficult and trying aspect are all the meetings. That's what makes retirement so enjoyable.

I am presently a weekend help out at three churches: St. James in Menomonee Falls and the newly formed Blessed Theresa of Calcutta Parish (formerly St. Clare in North Lake and St. John in Monches). I also receive requests to assist at nursing homes and convents.

I live in a condo in Franklin right along the Wehr Nature Center where I love to hike and enjoy God's creation there and in the Boerner Botanical Gardens where I worked 4 summers when I was in high school. Among the many things I looked forward to in retirement was spending some time each week at my cottage outside Fort Atkinson which I am now able to do.

I also look forward to working and worshipping with you and promise that my column will be shorter in the future.

Our **Bishop Brust Bingo** program has netted just a bit under \$1900 so far; roughly \$600 per Bingo Event after expenses and taxes. As mentioned in the Chancellor's report, we experienced a temporary setback when **Mike Jakus** broke his pelvis in early July; needless to say it was painful to Mike as well as to our Bingo. Our Council 3702 spirited volunteers came through, as usual, and we've been able to move forward, almost without a hitch. And Mike, though still struggling in his efforts to retain full mobility, expects to be on hand on Sept. 6 at Pere Marquette to Assure Proper Handling of Gross Receipts as stipulated in our Wisconsin State Bingo License.

Bradley Center Report – 2005-2006

A great big “THANK YOU” to the one hundred six Bishop Brust Council 3702 Family volunteers in the 2005 – 2006 Fraternal Year!

The average number of events per volunteer was just over three. Many volunteers did more than that, some five to eight times as many!

Our earnings per event were over \$480.00 for a total of \$17,900.00. Over \$4,000.00 of that was due to the five playoff events. There were thirty-two regular events. Tips came to about \$1,500.00, which was about equal to the amount of shortages.

Special thanks to all the managers! A lot of work is done before the event: calling for volunteers, arranging car pools and parking passes and sending the roster to the Bradley Center. **We desperately need more managers** if we are to continue working at the Bradley Center so no one manager is overburdened with too many events.

PRO-LIFE NEWS

Recently the government approved the sale of the morning after pill. This is a major setback for the pro-life cause. First of all, if it has its intended effect, **it destroys a living human being**. Secondly, it has the express approval of our president. For all his pro-life rhetoric one wonders where he is coming from!

Another bit of news that surfaced recently is the information that scientists now claim they can obtain stem cells without destroying the embryos while conducting stem cell research on embryos. **According to the latest information being published, this is simply not true**.
